There is a lot of room for other community users to use the diamond at the same time as the baseball kids.

Committees

Street culture

Some people have been concerned about Nelson's street culture, pan handlers and people without homes. Does our City Government have any role to play in addressing these concerns? **The city government** does have a role in addressing these concerns. We can create bylaws the keep the aggressive panhandlers off of the sidewalks in our downtown core. Many of the aggressive panhandlers come here for the summer. They know Nelson will feed them and the tourists will give them money. Nelson Cares is building a new facility now. We have our liaison worker and other provincial programs in place. We will always strive to do better and end homelessness.

Business community

Some of our Nelson business owners have felt they have not been consulted appropriately about issues that affect them. What would you do to mitigate that feeling?

Talk to business owners. Listen to them. Seems obvious.

The downtown business community suffers from such issues as limited parking, increased parking rates, competition from online shopping and the mall. What actions would you take to let the downtown business community know you are pro local business? Cleaning up the downtown is something we can control, we can't control online shopping. A clean, inviting and safe downtown will bring locals and tourists to our shopping district. Stopping the aggressive panhandlers who are scaring away shoppers and the buskers will help local business. We need to recognize that people come to Nelson because of our unique shops. Baker Street is as much of a draw as our beautiful scenery.

Housing

Some businesses in the service industry are concerned about the lack of affordable housing for their workers. Can the City do anything to help provide worker's housing?

Selkirk College has many students who need accommodation. This has put further demand on our already scarce available housing. Can the City do anything to help provide student housing? This is such a tough issue and so important to all who live in Nelson. If there are incentives we can offer builders to build more reasonable housing

for people trying to get into the housing market. If Selkirk is interested in building student housing the city can work with bylaws and zoning to make that happen. If people think the city should start building rent controlled apartments then that is going to take many discussions and provincial funding. It directly affects all who live in Nelson but is such an impossible thing for the city to control.

Services

Does Nelson feel old and dated? Are you interested in improving the look and feel of our community? Nelson just needs some TLC. some basic maintenance; grass cut, flowers planted, incentives for business owners to remove moldy awnings and improve front facade, fix up the Welcome to Nelson sign,

Money no object, what recreational and/or cultural facilities would you like to see here? massive sports complex; indoor soccer, arena, track, etc; cottonwood park stage and market facilities, walking bridge over the tracks from the waterfront to Railtown, How would you like to see Lakeside Rotary Park and Nelson's other parks improved? stage for outdoor music.
